Freshman Year "Pre-Nursing"

During Freshman year, our nursing students focus on their prerequisites.

Students must attain a 2.5 in Anatomy & Physiology 1 and 2, Chemistry, Nutrition and Microbiology in order to progress into the major sophomore year.











SOPHOMORE YEAR

Fall Semester

Nursing classes begin as well as practice of the foundational nursing skills in both our Skills/Simulation
Lab and Health Assessment lab.

Spring Semester

Concurrent with Med-Surg 1 students begin their clinical experiences.







Junior Year courses are broken into 4 specialties: MedSurg 2, Mental Health, Pediatrics, and Maternity

In addition to 2 days of classes students are in clinical 2 days/week. Each specialty course runs for 7 weeks. Other clinical experiences are: iCELS at UMMC learning and practicing advanced skills in our Skills/Simulation lab and simulation experiences in our Simulation Center.



SENIOR YEAR

Senior year courses include: Community

Nursing and Chronic Illness. This is augmented by Home Care experiences in our Simulated Home Care setting as well as simulation experiences in the Simulation Center. Student go into the community for community based learning/projects.

Spring semester is the Selective Practicum where students work in a clinical setting to complete their portfolio and outcomes of the program. In addition students must complete a leadership management course.





If you do choose to be test optional, you will be required to submit a letter of recommendation.
