

ADMISSION STANDARDS

- ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS -

To be considered for admission to Massachusetts Maritime Academy, candidates must be capable of college-level study and meet the minimum requirements below:


- ♦ 4 years of English
- ♦ 4 years of Mathematics: Including Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry or Trigonometry (or comparable coursework). At least one course must be completed during senior year
- ♦ 3 years of Science, all with a lab component: Technology/Engineering courses must be designated as science courses (taken for science credit) by the high school. Courses in Chemistry and Physics are strongly recommended
- ♦ 2 years of Social Science, including one course in United States History
- ♦ 2 years of Foreign Language: Two sequential, one-year courses in either a classical or modern language. Waivers are available under certain circumstances.
- ♦ 2 Elective Courses

- TEST SCORE REQUIREMENTS -

Due to the impact of COVID-19 on standardized testing across the country, the submission of SAT or ACT scores will be optional for Spring 2021 and Fall 2021 applicants. If you do choose to submit your standardized test scores, you must submit official reports from The College Board (SAT) or The ACT (ACT). Please note, score requests can take between 2-4 weeks to be delivered and added to a student's application.

Some families find Massachusetts Maritime Academy to be a very affordable public university, however, we understand that many families require financial assistance to help make it more cost-effective for them. Our Student Financial Services Office can provide financial aid options and also assist with the billing process and payment options.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) can be filed starting October 1. The priority deadline for filing the FAFSA is March 1st. Students who submit their application after this priority deadline may have reduced eligibility for aid. Based on the FAFSA, and other information you submit, the Financial Aid Office will determine your eligibility for a variety of funding options, including scholarships, grants, work-study programs and loans.
